Page Dairy Price Hearing Delayed

FTC Drafting Order On District Rates

Resumption of the hearing of a Federal Trade Commission's complaint against the Page Dairy Co., charging illegal price discrimination, has been postponed temporarily, it was disclosed today. The hearing was to have resumed today in the Federal Bldg.

Robert B. Gosline, an attorney for Page, said he had been informed by William L. Pack, FTC examiner, that a tentative order is being prepared by the commission for the dairy concern's consideration. If an agreement can be reached on the order, further hearing will be unnecessary, Mr. Gosline said.

Page is accused by FTC of selling homogenized milk at a lower price in several north-eastern Indiana and southern Michigan communities than in Toledo. The complaint alleged that dairies in those communi-
